Prizes: \$115.00 guaranteed. \$50.00 guaranteed first with \$25.00/2nd, \$15.00/3rd, \$25.00/high Class B, and others as entries and fund size permit. All moneys will be dispensed from the Stewart-Schubert Memorial Prize Fund. Donations to the fund are accepted at any time of the year by the Idaho Chess Assn.
